Poland has achieved impressive economic progress over recent years and has proven remarkably resilient to the world economic and financial crisis. The challenge is now to move towards a production structure based on higher technologies and skills to continue the catch up with living standards in other OECD economies. The OECD Economic Survey discusses policies to improve infrastructure investment and management and the use of skills in the Polish economy to foster productivity growth and well-being in the context of rapidly mounting demographic pressures. It discusses the role of the new government's policies and what needs to be done to ensure sustainable public and private financing to achieve these goals. The presentation will lay out the main findings and policy recommendations of the Economic Survey.

The OECD Economic Survey of Poland 2016 will be published on March 22nd. On March 23rd, Institute for Structural Research and the OECD organise a seminar to present and discuss the report.
